As a resident of Arlington I ask you to vote yes for Special Town Meeting Warrant Article 5: Arlington Resolution for a Ceasefire Proclamation, which calls for an immediate and permanent ceasefire in Palestine and Israel, the release of all hostages, the immediate provision of lifesaving aid, and a diplomatic resolution to the violence.

Prince Hall tirelessly advocated for his fellow enslaved Africans, and rejoiced when US sailors were freed by Barbary pirates, (A Charge). Take up his mantle, take up the example of one of our Founding Fathers who spoke out forcefully against bondage, who believed in the words of the Declaration of Independence; speak for a Ceasefire and return of hostages. Be the compassionate, be with the Peacemakers.
