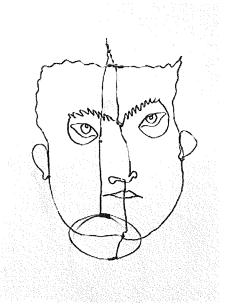

"Wacky Wire Faces"

The fourth grade students created wacky and funny faces using Twisteez wire. The students learned how to use wire to create artwork that is both sculptural and is able to resemble a line drawing. They were able to observe the wire artwork created by artist Alexander Calder for ideas.

First the students briefly reviewed different kinds of line, such as, zigzag, curvy, etc. After they were shown basic ways to connect the wire to itself without using any adhesives, the students were asked to figure out ways to create a wacky face. Their face had to resemble a human face, having eyes, nose, mouth, hair, etc., however they were free to make the face as wacky and creative as they wanted. The students were instructed to act as though they were "drawing" with the wire and use various types of lines in their artwork to make a more visually interesting piece.

"Mixed-Media Collages"

First grade students created abstract mixed-media collages based on the artwork of contemporary artist, Nancy Standlee. Standlee uses various materials, such as maps, magazines, newspapers, paint, and ink, to create iconic artwork of animals and objects.

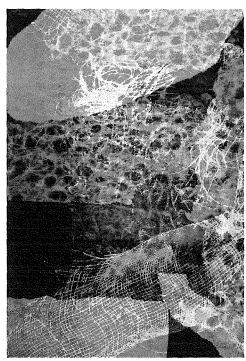
For the first part of this project, the first grade students created experimental paintings using tempera paint. They were given various items to paint with – paintbrushes, forks, sticks, and pieces of wood. Each object created a distinctive mark when painted with. When the paintings were dry, they either cut them up or added to them to make mixed-media collages of the subject of their choosing.

"Ziploc Bag Monoprints"

Second grade students experimented with layering monoprints using tempera paint and pieces of Ziploc bags. A monoprint is a printed painting. The students first observed and discussed many monoprints from various artists, including American artist, Donna Clark. They then painted pictures or designs on small pieces of plastic Ziploc bags. The wet images were then transferred by pressing the bag onto large pieces of paper. The student repeated this process many times to create a layered effect.

"Shopping Bag Monoprints"

Fifth grade students experimented with a unique style of monoprinting, or printing paintings. They created their printing plates using plastic grocery bags and thick paper. They glued pieces of the grocery bags to the paper and crumpled them so they created a crumpled texture. The students then painted the crumpled bags with tempera paint and pressed them onto paper. The results were interesting, detailed prints of the texture. The students then took this a step further and created artwork of their own choosing using these prints.



"Pattern Creatures"

The third grade students invented creatures using black and white patterns to create the illusion of various shades of gray. First, the students observed and discussed etchings by Rembrandt. Rembrandt often used black lines and cross-hatching (lines drawn crossing over each other) to create various shades of gray in his work. The students learned that other black and white patterns can also create shades of gray and the closer the patterns were on the paper, the darker the gray.

The students were then asked to use their imagination and create creatures using black sharpie on white paper. They were asked to use different patterns to "color-in" their creatures. When the viewer looks at the creature up close they see the patterns, however when the viewer stands farther away from the image the patterns blend together into grays.

To the Members of the School Committee:

I write to share my interest in being the School Committee's designee to the new Arlington Commission on Arts and Culture, contributing to the enhancement of our children's educational opportunities in and out of school, and raising our wonderful town's profile as a vital destination for arts, cultural, historical and recreational enrichment.

In brief, I'm a marketing communications professional combining over 20 years' experience in multichannel marketing and communications for business and nonprofit, along with a strong background in literary and performing arts, educational publishing, and academia.

Although I've only recently moved back to Arlington and Greater Boston after two decades in the Midwest, I've enjoyed becoming quickly involved in our schools and community. Having worked with multiple schools back in Milwaukee, I've served here on the Hardy School PTO Executive Board, launched its Communications Committee, co-chaired the Enrichment Committee, and participated in the School Council.

I've also tried to make community connections beyond the school, for example, joining Town Meeting, volunteering for Friends of Spy Pond Park and Belmont World Films' International Children's Film Festival, and spearheading a novel service-learning environmental education program for Hardy in collaboration with FSPP, Parks & Rec, the Tree Committee, and Town DPW.

Most recently, after I volunteered for the Tourism and Economic Development (A-TED) committee, Clarissa Rowe suggested my strengths and interests may be best aligned with the new Arlington Commission on Arts and Culture, where I've begun attending meetings and advising the marketing committee on the build-out of the new ArtsArlington website.

And, given both my involvement with APS, and personal experience in the arts and education, I immediately saw a direct but currently unsupported link between the interests of our schools, the arts commission, and the broader needs of our Town.

For just a few examples: ACAC certainly has a role to play in fostering innovations in STEAM education, potentially providing support in the form of grantmaking for projects in alignment with AEF; providing access to diverse arts professionals to participate in school enrichment; and creating a parent-resource for learning about direly-needed creative summer camp, days off, and afterschool instruction. As was discussed in Town Meeting, APS has increasingly relied on PTOs that strain to fulfill pretty fundamental educational needs – from providing library books and musical instruments to sponsoring underrepresented cultural programming as part of D&I – that ACAC may help alleviate. I'd also like to see some consideration of how Hardy, Gibbs, AHS and other non-APS schools could be part of rather than peripheral to the new Cultural District.

As requested in your call, I'll attach here a resume, but would also be glad to discuss with you other non-employment aspects, and more ideas for how ACAC can benefit our schools.

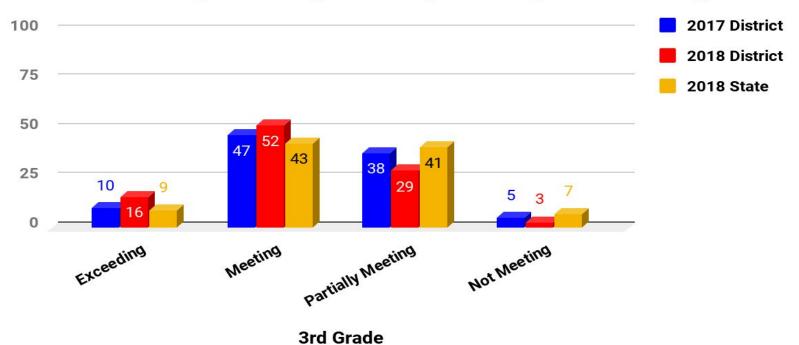

Student Growth Percentile (SGP)

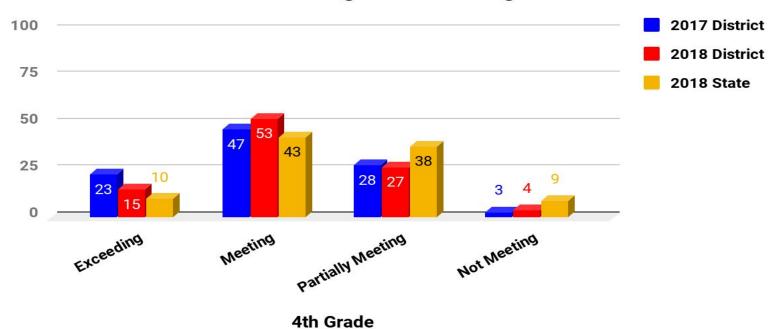
SGPs are percentiles (ranging from 1 to 99) calculated by comparing one student's history of MCAS scores to the scores of all the other students in the state with a similar history of MCAS scores. We refer to this group of all other students with similar score histories as a student's *academic peers*. In simple terms, students earning high growth percentiles answered more questions correctly on the spring 2010 MCAS test than their academic peers; conversely, students earning low growth percentiles answered fewer questions correctly than their academic peers.

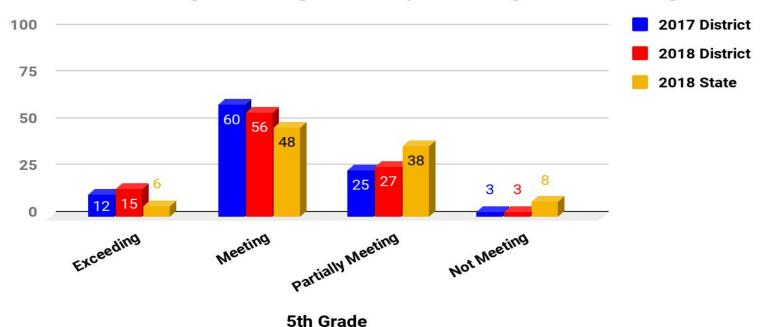

Attached you will find a copy of the monthly financial reporting packet for the period ending 9/30/2018. There are four different reports for your review. Included are separate monthly budget tracking reports for each of the three different funding source categories: general fund (town appropriation), grants funds (state and federal), and revolving accounts. There is also a report that combines the spending totals from each funding source category into one report.

General Fund Report

The general fund expenditure report includes spending through 9/30/2018, and is summarized by object code. You may be used to seeing this format as this is consistent with the reporting that has been used in the past. This report is a year to date budget report, created directly from Munis. Combined with columns for our projections for the remainder of the year, we arrived at the 'available budget' total that you'll find in this report. The bottom line unencumbered balance is currently projected at just over \$423,553. It is important to note that this does not mean that we expect there to be a surplus, but instead represents the total remaining after all known expenses at the time of this report have been encumbered.

Grant Accounts Report

The grant account report includes a year to date tracking of revenue and expenditure totals for each of our FY19 grant accounts. This report includes both federal and state grants. Currently all of these grants we included in our budget plan have been approved, and are active. Below is a list of grants included in our budget plan, the approved grant amount, and the variance between the two. The current approved grant amounts are \$172,104 less than what was approved in the budget plan. This is mostly due to the Title 1 decrease, but also there was some increases in other grants that help mitigate the effect. As we have discussed, the Title 1 decrease is due to the district poverty percentage not meeting the 5% limit for eligibility beyond the basic grant allocation.

Revolving Accounts Report

The revolving account report includes year to date tracking of revenue and expenditure totals for each revolving account. The current projections are in line with the approved budget plan, and there was a positive change in the Circuit Breaker account since the budget was passed. The circuit breaker amount allocated for the FY19 budget increased from \$2,020,136 to \$2,317,327 for an increase of \$297,191

Combined Funding Source Report

The all in combined funding source report includes spending from all three funding categories through 9/30/2018, and is summarized by object code. The bottom line unencumbered balance includes the totals from all three individual reports. The new total all in combined budget has increased from \$72,178,032 to \$72,303,119. The increase in revolving accounts was able to offset the decrease in grant accounts.

Transfer Request

The general fund report includes transfers to true up each account based on turnover and moves/adds/changes made since the budget was approved. Below is a breakdown of the proposed transfer request between each budget category. We recommend that a vote be taken to adjust budget categories as presented below.

Rainbow Commission resolution regarding equality and civil rights in the state of Massachusetts – passed at the October 18, 2018 meeting

The Massachusetts House of Representatives and Senate approved the addition of gender identity to the Massachusetts Public Accommodations Law (M.G.L c. 272, §§ 92A, 98 and 98A) on July 7, 2016. This legislation, An Act relative to transgender anti-discrimination (S. 2407), was signed into law the following day. The updated Public Accommodations Law has been in full effect since October 1, 2016.

The November 6, 2018 statewide election includes ballot question 3, considering whether to uphold or repeal the part of the Massachusetts Public Accommodations Law that prohibits discrimination on the basis of gender identity.

Full and equal access to public accommodations is a basic human right. Trans and gender non-conforming people must be safe from discrimination in public spaces in order to fully participate in civic life. The repeal of this law would have a devastating effect for transgender and gender non-conforming family members, friends, and neighbors, and therefore to our community as a whole.

Arlington Town Meeting in 2017 created this LGBTQIA+ Rainbow Commission to promote equality-affirming policies regarding the full spectrum of sexual orientations and gender identities, and one of the town's principles is to "be known for the warm welcome and respect we extend to all."

Therefore, the Rainbow Commission endorses the Yes on 3 effort by Freedom for All Massachusetts to uphold the current law and say clearly: Discrimination has no place in Massachusetts and no place in Arlington.

From the 2017 National School Climate Survey conducted by GLSEN (https://www.glsen.org/article/2017-national-school-climate-survey-1):

- 44.6% of LGBT students felt unsafe at school because of because of their gender expression, and 35.0% because of their gender.
- 34.8% of LGBTQ students missed at least one entire day of school in the past month because they felt unsafe or uncomfortable.
- Approximately 4 in 10 students avoided gender-segregated spaces in school due to safety concerns (bathrooms: 42.7%; locker rooms: 40.6%).
- 94.0% of LGBTQ students heard negative remarks about gender expression; 62.2% heard these remarks often or frequently.
- 87.4% of LGBTQ students heard negative remarks specifically about transgender people; 45.6% heard them often or frequently.
- 71.0% of students reported hearing negative remarks about gender expression from teachers or other school staff.
- 42.1% of transgender and gender nonconforming students had been prevented from using their name or pronoun.
- 46.5% of transgender and gender nonconforming students had been required to use a bathroom matching the gender assigned at birth.
- 43.6% of transgender and gender nonconforming students had been required to use a locker room matching the gender assigned at birth.
- LGBTQ students who experienced higher levels of victimization because of their gender expression:
 - Were more likely to have missed school in the past month than those who experienced lower levels (61.6% vs. 23.2%);
 - Had lower GPAs (2.9 vs. 3.3);
 - Were twice as likely to report that they did not plan to pursue any postsecondary education (9.6% vs. 4.9%);
 - Were more likely to have been disciplined at school (52.1% vs. 30.8%); and
 - Had lower self-esteem and school belonging and higher levels of depression.
- Compared to LGBTQ students with no supportive school staff, students with many (11 or more) supportive staff at their school:
 - Were less likely to feel unsafe because of their gender expression (34.8% vs. 51.0%);
 - Were less likely to miss school because they felt unsafe (20.1% vs. 48.8%);
 - Had higher GPAs (3.3 vs. 3.0);
 - Were less likely to say they might not graduate high school and more likely to plan on pursuing post-secondary education; and
 - Felt greater belonging to their school community.
- Students who had seen a Safe Space sticker or poster in their school were more likely to identify school staff who were supportive of LGBTQ students and more likely to feel comfortable talking with school staff about LGBTQ issues.

- LGBTQ students in middle school had more hostile school experiences than LGBTQ students in high school, including experiencing higher rates of biased language, victimization, and anti-LGBTQ discriminatory school policies and practices.
- LGBTQ middle school students were less likely than high school students to have access
 to LGBTQ-related school resources, including GSAs, supportive educators, LGBTQinclusive curricular resources, and inclusive policies.
- Transgender students were more likely than other students to report having changed schools because they felt unsafe or uncomfortable; and
- Four times more likely than cisgender LGBQ students to report that they were not planning to complete high school or were not sure if they would complete high school

A study published by the American Academy of Pediatrics (http://pediatrics.aappublications.org/content/early/2018/09/07/peds.2017-4218) recently reported:

- Nearly 14% of adolescents of all genders reported a previous suicide attempt
- Trans males reported the highest rate of attempted suicide (50.8%)
- those who were nonbinary (41.8%)
- trans females (29.9%)
- those who were gender-questioning (27.9%)
- cis females (17.6%),
- and cis males (9.8%).

Facts About Suicide from The Trevor Project, the leading national organization providing crisis intervention and suicide prevention services to LGBTQ people under 25 (https://www.thetrevorproject.org/resources/preventing-suicide/facts-about-suicide/):

• Each episode of LGBT victimization, such as physical or verbal harassment or abuse, increases the likelihood of self-harming behavior by 2.5 times on average.

- A study published in the Journal of School Health found transgender students were 2.5 times more likely than non-transgender students to use cocaine and methamphetamines in their lifetime and twice as likely to report the misuse of prescription pain medication.
- Kris T. De Pedro, an assistant professor of educational studies at Chapman University and the study's lead author, explained that gender identity is not the cause of increased substance abuse among transgender students, but rather, discrimination is.

"When it comes to transgender teens, it's the transphobia that impacts [their drug use], not being transgender," De Pedro said.

"In order to reduce the likelihood of a kid to resort to drugs as a means to cope, there has to be some sort of social support mechanism," De Pedro continued. "We have these drug prevention programs in schools that are for everybody, but we really need to fill a fundamental need for [transgender] kids, and that's the need to feel accepted and affirmed."

Dr. Allison-Ampe presented the Arlington High School Art display.

Public Participation

None

Dr. Allison-Ampe informed the committee that Dr. Bodie was absent due to being on vacation and Mr. Spiegel is attending a conference. Mr. Thielman will arrive late due to work.

Arlington Community Education Annual Update

Ms. Jennifer Rothenberg, and Ms. Andrea Loeb of Community Education provided and update on all the fall, winter, spring and summer programming. The SummerFun programs for the students is the most attended program and students enjoy having teachers that teach a subject during the school year teach another subject during the summer fun programming. Teachers, students and parents appreciate the programs offered. The Community Education programs continue to grow each year. The demand for additional programs are needed, but the main challenge for the Community Education program is space at each of the schools. Ms. Rothenberg wanted to make sure that the Community Education program continues at the high school even after the high school is completed with the rebuild project.

Committee members pointed out that more space is needed for all after-school programs and agreed that it's a challenge. Ms. Morgan, Mr. Kardon and Dr. Allison-Ampe agreed that since Community Education programming is doing well, and will be paying a building rental fee, they should continue to reach out to free and reduce lunch families and Mr. Kardon raised the issue to offer some additional scholarship money to those students. They appreciated the money provided for the Gibbs library funds and scholarship money.

State Accountability Report and Analysis

Dr. MacNeal and Ms. Paula O'Sullivan provided a brief overview of the system using the Department of Education and Secondary Education slides to show the difference on the accountability indicators used. Both Dr. MacNeal and Ms. O'Sullivan worked together to analysis the data and will continue to work with the data team and dive deeper into it and bring forth a report to our next meeting on how Arlington students have done in our district compared to other schools districts in the state. The MCAS data can be found on the DESE website and is available for all to review.

MASC Annual Business Meeting Discuss resolutions appointment of delegate

Dr. Allison-Ampe asked if Mr. Hayner would like to serve as the delegate for Arlington at the MASC Annual Business meeting during the MASC/MASS Conference, November 2018.

Mr. Schlichtman moved for Mr. Hayner to be our elected delegate at the MASC/MASS Conference, seconded by Ms. Susse.

Voted: 6-0

Dr. Allison-Ampe read through the MASC resolutions and Mr. Hayner got a sense from the committee as to how he should vote, the committee felt he should vote yes on all but two of the resolutions.

Discuss Policy BEA: Regular School Committee Meetings

Mr. Schlichtman said as the subcommittee was going through the policy manual and read BEA Regular School Committee Meeting policy, it defines meeting date as Thursday. He noted most events seem to be on Thursdays at the high school and members of the School Committee have no reserved parking and noted members would like to attend these events. With so many conflicts on using the building on Thursday he suggested that we put forth to move the Regular School Committee meetings to Tuesday. Mr. Thielman and Dr. Allison-Ampe said they respect the committee's request, but currently they are involved with the AHS Building Committee meetings and all are held on Tuesdays probably for the next six to seven years and cannot support it. Mr. Hayner said the issue is not based on a specific night, but verbal request to avoid scheduling events on Thursday nights. The committee members agreed that it didn't make sense to change the night until after the high school project is complete.

Dr. MacNeal announced he regrets to inform us that the Chief Financial Officer is moving on to another position and would like to thank Mr. John Danizio for all his work over the year and half and wishes him well as he pursues his career goals.

Superintendent Annual Educator Plan

Practice Goal: In order to effectively supervise and support principals, as well as support high expectations for teaching and learning, and consistency and common focus on instruction, I will visit each school a minimum of three times between September 2017 and June 2018, which will include a meeting with the principal and classroom walk-throughs.

Rationale: The rationale for this practice goal is that the school visits by the Superintendent are important to support and ensure a consistent focus on district and school goals, maintain visibility in the district, support principals, and understand first-hand the needs in each school.

The Superintendent is responsible for (1-B) "observing principal practice and artifacts, ensuring that principals identify a variety of effective teaching strategies and practice when they observe practice". Additionally, the Superintendent must (1-D), "make at least three unannounced visits to each school to observe principal practice every year and provides targeted constructive feedback to all administrators. Acknowledges effective practice and provides redirection and support for those whose practice is less than *Proficient*." It is only possible to provide this level of oversight by being present on a regular basis in schools.

Key Actions:

- 1. Schedule school visits in my calendar with sufficient time to meet with the principal and visit classrooms and/or observe meetings.
- 2. Keep a log of visits with general notes on the focus of conversations and file any artifacts, if any, from each visit.

Benchmarks:

- 1. Calendar will show schedule and time of each visit.
- 2. School visit log will provide general notes on the focus of each school visit.

Student Achievement Goal 2017-2018 Superintendent Annual Educator Plan Submitted by: Kathleen Bodie May 2017

Student Achievement Goal: Oversee the development of a plan for the Gibbs School for curriculum, operations, scheduling, and culture to be completed in June 2018.

Rationale: The Gibbs School will open in September 2018 as a sixth grade school, following a year-long process to determine the best alternative to address the growing enrollment at Ottoson Middle School. The two final options under consideration were an addition to the existing school or a renovation of the Gibbs School to be either a smaller grade 6-8 school or a single grade school. The choice was to open a sixth grade only school. The funding for this option was approved by the voters overwhelmingly in June 2016.

Planning for a sixth grade school provides the district with an opportunity to re-think the education provided to sixth grade students to ensure that they have the most successful transition between their neighborhood elementary schools and the larger, more challenging environment of Ottoson Middle School, and then Arlington High School.

In order to develop a cohesive and strategic plan for the educational environment of the Gibbs School, administrators and teachers, with input from parents and the community, will need to work collaboratively and intensively over the next school year.

Key Actions:

Actions in 2016-2017:

To prepare for the work of developing a comprehensive plan for the Gibbs School, a grant application was submitted to AEF in February 2017 to funds stipends for teachers to participate on a Gibbs Planning Committee, which would begin its work in May 2017 and continue through the summer 2018. A grant of \$30,000 was awarded by AEF. The application states that the work of the Planning Committee will be shared with parents/community in two evening informational sessions and a fifth grade orientation night and soliciting feedback. Parental input will also be shared with the Planning Committee.

A Planning Committee of sixth grade teachers and administrators was constituted in May. Participants chose to be on one of three subcommittees, each of which is cochaired by a curriculum leader and a teacher. The Chair of the Planning Committee is the newly appointed principal of Gibbs School.

The subcommittees will focus respectively on one of three major aspects of the new educational environment:

- 1. School community building, including programs and structures for ongoing support for an inclusive school environment and success for all students
- 2. Curriculum, instruction, and assessment, including structures for on-going support in improving teaching and learning
- 3. Building operations including schedule development

Actions in 2017-2018:

- 1. A mission statement for the Gibbs School will be developed with input from all stakeholders.
- 2. The Planning Committee and subcommittees will meet for a total of 12 hours over the summer 2017. Progress on work will be shared regularly with the Superintendent for feedback and approval. All aspects of the plan will require the final approval of the Superintendent.
- 3. Four days of responsive classroom professional development will be scheduled during the 2017-2018 school year for all sixth grade teachers and specialists who will move to the Gibbs School in 2018. The learnings from these sessions will help inform and refine the plan for the school, as well as provide a common language and instructional tools for developing a welcoming learning environment in which all students feel they belong to the school community.
- 4. The evening information sessions will be scheduled by September 30, 2017. The date and time for each event will be sent to parents with ample notice. Feedback from these sessions will be communicated to the Planning Committee.
- 5. The School Committee will periodically be informed of aspects of the plan, as well as be apprised of construction news.
- 6. Time on early release days will be provided for the on-going work of the Planning Committee.
- Outside professional development assistance, particularly in the areas of projectbased learning and social emotional support programs, will be provided to the Planning Committee as needed.
- 8. The School Committee will receive a report of the solicited feedback collected from parents and community members who attended the information sessions.

Evidence of Success:

A comprehensive report on the plan for the Gibbs School relative to the three areas of focus will be at least in draft form by June 2018. Further refinement of the plan may continue during the summer 2018. A final plan for the opening of school in September 2018 will be completed by August 2018. The plan will be shared with the School Committee, all teachers and staff of the Gibbs School and parents and community members.

2.1 To ensure the success of *all* students, Arlington Public Schools will continue to enhance, refine and communicate its comprehensive multi-tiered system of supports as a framework to improve student outcomes PK-12 in academics, social emotional competencies, cultural competency and college and career readiness. This will provide universal high-quality core educational experiences in a safe and supportive learning environment with supplemental and targeted interventions/supports for students who experience academic and/or behavioral difficulties identified through a refined student support team process.

Teachers and staff will have professional development in topics of cultural competency as part of the district's overall focus on social-emotional growth.

- Creation of the Safe & Supportive Schools (SASS) District-wide Committee by October 30, 2017.

Proposed Homeland Security rule change would impact schools

Something that may not be making most members' education radar this week is a Homeland Security release from September 22 of proposed rule changes.

Instead of keeping the current definition of a "public charge" as someone "primarily dependent on the government for subsistence," the Department of Homeland Security would start denying green cards and temporary visas to anyone who is deemed likely at any time in the future to receive any government benefit from a specified list.

If immigrants stop signing up for such benefits, how does this impact schools? Two ways immediately come to mind:

1. CHIP and Medicaid, both of which are federal benefits, cover 39% of children in the United States. Imagine nearly 4 out of 10 children not having health insurance: not getting well visits, not visiting the doctor when they are sick, not getting vaccinations. Now imagine what that does to schools. 2. Under direct certification, SNAP and other benefits are how the determination is made of who is eligible for free and reduced lunch. It is how community eligibility--currently feeding entire districts of children--is determined. The result will be hungry kids both in and out of school. It also is what counts for economically disadvantaged numbers in the foundation budget, so districts won't be counting all of their kids who

English language arts and math should be complete by spring 2019, when grades 3 and 6 finish the transition.

In 2018, high school students took the legacy MCAS tests. Compared to 2017, the percentage of students statewide who scored Proficient or higher dipped 1 percentage point each in English language arts (91 to 90 percent), math (79 to 78 percent) and science and technology/engineering (74 to 73 percent). The next-generation tests will be introduced at the high school level in English language arts and math in spring 2019, but the minimum passing level will not change until at least the class of 2023.

Parents of students in grades 3-8 should also receive their child's scores from their school district in the coming weeks. When reviewing students' scores, students, parents and educators should keep in mind that:

- In general, the standards for Meeting Expectations are more rigorous than the standards for reaching the Proficient level on the legacy MCAS.
- Next-generation MCAS scores should not be compared to legacy MCAS scores.
- The approximately 50 percent of grades 3-8 students who scored in the Meeting or Exceeding Expectations categories is not the result of a grading curve; it is where the scores fell according to the standards that educators established.

Accountability and Assistance Levels
The new accountability system is designed to measure how a school or district is doing and what kind of support it may need. Given that this is the first year under a new accountability system, Commissioner Riley is not designating any new schools as underperforming this year.

With the data being run through a new accountability system, there are no new schools designated underperforming this year. Schools that have not exited underperforming status will continue to receive targeted assistance from DESE.

The new accountability system designated the vast majority of schools and districts as not requiring assistance or intervention (they fell in the Meeting Targets or Partially Meeting Targets categories), while other schools and districts were designated as in need of Focused/ Targeted Support or Broad/Comprehensive Support.

As permitted under the federal Every Student Succeeds Act, the accountability results broadened the array of items considered in evaluating schools. Both the normative results, which rank schools across the state, and the criterion-referenced results, which evaluate districts and schools on their progress towards individual goals, now include both achievement and growth in MCAS, but also progress for ELL students, and working on chronic absenteeism.

High school systems further add graduation measures, including not only four-year graduation and drop-out rate, but a new persistence measure to credit district work on students who take more than four years to graduate.

High schools also add a measure on completion of challenging coursework. The criterion-referenced results weigh the full student group at half of the measure, and the lowest performing 25% at half the measure, putting an unprecedented emphasis on students most at risk in each category.

Because of the additional information available this year, school committees have an opportunity to have valuable results, but district work with English language learners, in absenteeism, in access and completion of advanced coursework, and in ensuring students make it to graduation. As school and district report cards will be released this winter, districts will have additional information to discuss in improving their work.

to increase effectiveness by exploring the root causes of challenges and incorporating empathy of stakeholders along the way. Coupling these two concepts together allows a district to pivot resources financially and instructionally. Added to this is the application of a collective impact approach to frame and tackle deeply entrenched and complex social problems.

Menzo focuses on the need for school leaders and administrators to identify the root cause of a issue in order to be best positioned to generate solutions that are sustainable and effective. As part of their role in this process school committee members work closely with town officials and agencies to increase community understanding of what the school district is doing for students and families. In addition, Menzo explains how he worked with staff to incorporate these new methodologies in a variety of process improvement activities. Staff at all levels, parents, students and community members were integral in first defining the problems and challenges and then working together to identify solution that have had real and measurable impact and sustainable change for all learners in the school district and community. Over

the last two years, through this process, the district has been able to identity nearly \$800,00 of savings.

Legislators of the Year

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In announcing the award, MASC President-Elect (and Holyoke School Committee member) Devin Sheehan commended the Representative as "a passionate advocate for public education in Commonwealth since being elected to the General Court in 2012. Senator Harriette Chandler, a nine-term legislator representing the city of Worcester, and parts of the towns of Boylston, Clinton, Holden, Northborough, Princeton and West Boylston, served as Senate President from December 2017 to July 2018, only the second woman to serve in that capacity. She currently serves as chair of the Senate Committee on Steering and Policy, vice chair of the Joint Committee on Higher Education and also serves as Co-Chair of the Prevention for Health Caucus.

Chandler began her political career when she was elected to the Worcester School Committee in

1991, serving until 1994. A year later, she was elected to the House of Representatives where she served until in November, 2000 she became the first woman from Worcester to be elected to the MA Senate.

Throughout her career in the legislature, Senator Chandler has served on numerous committees including Ways & Means, Housing, Health Care, Public Health and Ethics.

Senator Chandler earned degrees from Wellesley College (B.A.), Simmons College Graduate School of Management (M.B.A.) and Clark University (Ph.D).

According to MASC President Beverly Hugo "it is said that successful politicians never forget where they came from, and Senator Harriette Chandler is proof of that adage. Since beginning her political career as a member of the Worcester School Committee Senator Chandler has never lost sight of the needs of children. From her work in the Legislature on health care, to her most recent service as the Senate President, Senator Chandler has ensured that those who are voiceless have a voice on Beacon Hill. Most recently, the Senator's tireless advocacy for regional transportation reimbursement and for recognition of the needs of English language learners put additional funding into district budgets across the Commonwealth. State Releases 2018 Assessment and Accountability Results

arlier this month the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education released both the 2018 MCAS results and the 2018 accountability results and assistance levels. This year marked the second year of the grade 3-8 next generation MCAS and the debut of the state's new accountability system. The new system is designed to measure how a school or district is doing and what kind of support it may need, is more comprehensive than the previous system and complies with the 2015 federal Every Student Succeeds Act.

MCAS Results

Next-generation MCAS scores fall into four categories: Exceeding Expectations, Meeting Expectations, Partially Meeting Expectations and Not Meeting Expectations.

The state results of the 2018 next-

generation MCAS in grades 3-8 English language arts and math were similar to those from 2017 in that approximately 50 percent of the students who took the test scored Meeting Expectations or above. The achievement categories were established in 2017 by a comprehensive group of MA educators in collaboration with DESE and are designed to reflect what students need to know to be successful in the next grade.

The next-generation MCAS was developed after the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education voted in November 2015 to create an updated, Massachusetts-specific test administered via computer. Schools have been phasing in computer-based testing, and in spring 2018, 89 percent of students in grades 3-8 took MCAS on a computer. The Department expects that the transition to computer-based testing in

Increased Effectiveness

THE LEGALITY OF SCHOOL COMMITTEE EXPENDITURES TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF A LAWSUIT TO COMPEL ADEQUATE FUNDING FOR K-12 EDUCATION

During the course of my research on the above captioned matter I contacted the agency which oversees municipal finance, the Massachusetts Department of Revenue, Division of Local Services (DLS). Massachusetts Courts generally give deference to the opinion of the agency invested with such oversight. The Bureau of Municipal Finance Law of (DLS), in 1994 issued an opinion to the Town Accountant of Greenfield File No. 94-1050, which determined that a Greenfield School Committee donation to the Council of Fair School Finance was not permited under the Massachusetts Constitution, Article 46, the "Anti-aid" amendment. The Council of Fair School Finance was the entity that directed the McDuffy case, 415 Mass. 545 (1993) and received funds to help pay for the cost of the litigation. The Greenfield School Committee may pay for general legal services under G.L. Ch. 71, S. 37F. The DLS concluded that S.37F provides authority for a school committee to pay for litigation counsel, which it employs itself for a case in which it is a party, but that the school committee cannot pay for legal counsel of another school committee or for private parties. The DLS appears to carve out an exception for the filing of an amicus brief on a matter that could have a direct affect on the school committee. The Greenfield opinion concludes that if such authority to challenge the school funding mechanism exists at all for a city or town, it is a general town responsibility and would seem to require a specific appropriation for that purpose by the city or town. I recommend that you share this DLS opinion with the school committee legal counsel and the town counsel or city solicitor. I have been informed recently by DLS that they have not issued a superseding opinion, and that the Greenfield opinion remains its view on this matter. The complete Greenfield opinion may be found on the MASC website.

THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE, THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND SECURITY AND DESE RECENTLY HAS RELEASED A MODEL MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING GOVERNING THE ROLE OF SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS.

As part of the criminal justice reform law (C. 69 of the Acts and Resolves of 2018, S.27) enacted in April, MOU'S between school districts and police departments must provide new details about school resource officers' roles and responsibilities, ensuring that school resource officers do not take the place of appointed school disciplinarians, enforcers of school regulations, or school based mental health providers. The new law ensures that school resource officers do not use police powers to address traditional school discipline issues and restricts law enforcement action in response to certain school-based offences.

The MOU is drafted in contract form (12 pages) and should be reviewed by school counsel. It is important to note that this document may serve as a guide to school districts and municipalities and is not required to be adopted. I have been informed that the revisions to C. 71, S.37P or other relevant provisions of law are found in bold type in the proposed draft and should be addressed. It is my view that while the MOU requires the signatures of the superintendent of schools and the chief of police, the final document should be subject to school committee review and approval. The MOU addresses school policy, budget matters and designation of office space for the SRO among other matters that impact school committee powers and duties.
