2021 Summer Programming Update

- **K-5 Title-One Extended Program:** We are offering an Expanded Elementary Summer Literacy and Math program. The program has been created to invite students who receive reading and math support during the school year.
 - ELA and Math Program:
 - Dates: July 13-August 12 (5 weeks)
 - Teaching Time: 9:00 AM-1:00 PM (reading and math will coordinate for staggered time start (reading 9-12 and Math 10-1).
 - 3 days a week: Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday
 - Sites:
 - Thompson
 - Remote
 - Students who were remote this year seemed to have a preference to continue that model
 - Length of each session:
 - In-person: 60 mins
 - Remote: 40 mins
 - Small groups of 4-5 students
 - Selection Process: Will offer to students currently receiving services as well as others that are recommended by teachers
 - Targeted Instruction (Reading K-3, Math K-5)
 - **■** ELA Enrollment:
 - 98 students for reading: 54 in-person and 44 remote
 - Math Coordinator & Enrollment:
 - 94 students for math: 59 students in person and 35 remote
 - Math and Reading Enrollment:
 - Out of the enrollment numbers listed above there are 42 students enrolled for both reading and math (27 in person, 15 remote)
 - **Staffing:** We will have the staffing needed to run the ELA and Math program (8 staff members for math, 7 or 8 staff members for reading)

• **Gibbs:** Book clubs run by reading teachers for rising sixth and seventh graders. An invitation will be extended by the principal to students who will benefit from reading practice.

- Teachers: 2 teachers have committed
 - Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday for 5 weeks, similar to the elementary plan
- **OMS:** book club for rising eighth-graders who will benefit from reading practice
 - Selection Process: Will offer to students who are recommended by the reading department
 - No teacher at this point

Math

- Dates: July 13-August 12 (5 weeks)
- Teaching Time: TBD
- 3 days a week: Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday
- Sites:
 - o OMS
 - o Remote
- Length of each session:
 - o In-person: 60 mins
 - o Remote: 40 mins
- Small groups of 8-12 students
- Selection Process: Will offer to students currently receiving services as well as others that are recommended by teachers
- Targeted Instruction
- Staffing: We will probably need between 3 and 6 teachers. We are still experiencing issues with identifying staffing for the program. As of 4/28, we only have a total of 2 interested teachers for any math program offered 6-12. Of these, only one will teach in person
- Invitations will be sent out at the end of this week

• Arlington High School

- Credit Recovery: Based on term 3 grades Deans, Counselors, and Curriculum Leaders are working with students at risk of failure to identify the need for and interest in summer credit recovery courses.
 - Typical summer school credit recovery courses are accepted for students who fail a class with a grade higher than 50% or a passing grade for at least half of the quarters. If a student fails with a grade lower than 50%,

- they may get permission for a course replacement class that must be approved by the dean. These would typically be a community college course or course offered through a private program.
- We will continue to offer PLATO online learning as our credit recovery program for students. Students will have a weekly check-in live or by zoom for progress and support and students may request to work in the school.
- Where there is a need for key subjects, we plan to offer an in-person credit recovery course at AHS. We currently anticipate options in Modern World History, English 9/10, English 11/12, Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra 2, and possibly PreCalculus.
- Students may access outside credit recovery summer school classes that have traditionally been offered at Arlington Catholic and other local high schools.
- Students who have fallen behind may also be approved to use dual enrollment at local community colleges to replace some classes.
- Enrichment: Arlington High School has a longstanding program under which students take Massive Online Open Courses (MOOCs) through the EdX and Coursera platforms. These teacher-supervised online courses are offered for grades and elective credit. MOOC student proposal flyer. In order to support students seeking academic opportunities and enrichment during the summer, we will be adding courses for the summer of 2021.
- English Learner Education (ELE) Summer Opportunities 2021: There will be a couple of options for ELLs to engage with further enrichment in language learning and targeted ELL support:
 - Option 1: Remote Elementary English Learner Summer Program (SELL)
 an elementary ELL enrichment program for entering (grades 1-5 as of September 2021) for ELLs that are identified as newcomers (Level 1).
 - There are an estimated 15-20 students at this time interested with currently two (2) elementary teachers committed to teaching. We will be posting internally and externally for further teachers interested in teaching in the SELL program.
 - Teachers: 2 teachers have committed, 1 TBD

- Enrichment Program will be offered Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays during the month of July from 8:30 10:30.
- o Option 2: Individual Targeted and/or Small Group ELE Student Support will also be offered in the summer for ELL struggling students in elementary and secondary schools. ELLs identified as struggling learners from various data points (i.e., ACCESS, teacher recommendation, student samples of work, grades, etc.) will also be offered a chance for further language and content support to extend the school year through small group instruction and/or ELL grade-level tutoring. The small group and/or individual ELL summer support/tutoring will be scheduled with teachers accordingly. This will be targeted ELL student support. An estimated number of targeted ELLs in need of individual tutoring and/or small group ELL support is around 10-15 at this time respectively.
 - **Location**: Remote/In-person
 - We cannot give an exact number of students at this time because we are still awaiting results from ACCESS testing.
 - Teachers: Teachers who have committed:
 - 2 remote
 - 2 in-person
 - 1 alternate
- **Notes:** Additional teachers needed for all ELL summer SELL and targeted options and internal and external candidates have/will be sought. There is Title III funding for staffing summer.
