- Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion work
















Multi-Tiered Systems of Support



MTSS takes a proactive approach to identifying students with academic or behavioral needs. The integrated instruction model of MTSS uses collected data to assess student needs and provide them with interventions in appropriate tiers. Early assessment and intervention for these students can help them catch up with their peers sooner. The key components of MTSS include:

- Universal screening of all students early in the school year (i.e. Kindergarten Screening, Reading Assessments)
- Tiers of interventions that can be amplified in response to levels of need (RTI Reading, RTI Math)
- Ongoing data collection and continual assessment
- Schoolwide approach to expectations and supports (Responsive Classroom & PBIS)
- Parent involvement

District coaches and our DEI Leader will be important resources and supports as we do this work with a continued focus on equity.

2021-22 School Priorities



- Early Literacy Skill Instruction and Assessment K-3
- Literacy Instruction and Assessment in grades 4 and 5
- Multi-Tiered Systems of Support
- Assessment of Hardy's Student Support Team (SST) process and Tiered Interventions
- Collaboration between Hardy committees with a focus on equity work including the Hardy School Council, the Diversity and Inclusion Group (DIG), and the Parent-Teacher Organization (PTO), às well as our Hardy students

Key Initiatives and Action Steps



Literacy:

- To provide continuous support and training for educators in early literacy learning and the ways to access and continuously monitor progress
- To introduce the Fundations phonics curriculum in kindergarten and 3rd grade to create a continuous scope and sequence of lessons K-3
- To assess all students K-3 using DIBELS as a progress monitoring tool School Culture:
 - To engage in professional development on Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (PBIS) with the PBIS Academy grant work made possible by the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)
 - To continue to grow our Hardy School Culture Team and use the team as teacher leaders to share the learning during faculty meetings and other planning times
 - To roll out our new school-wide behavior matrix
 - To expand our use of the Second Step curriculum at grades 2, 4, and 5
 - To raise the rate of participation of family members in our shared decision making process with the help of PTO, School Council, and DIG committee members
