## APS "Test to Return" Protocol A: for individuals who test positive for COVID-19

# Español / Português / 中国人 / 日本

Return to school: On day 11 OR on days 6, 7, 8, 9, or 10, provided the Individual:

- Has tested negative on a rapid antigen test and <u>reported their result to APS using this</u> form; and
- Has been without fever for 24 hours (and without taking fever-reducing medications); and,
- Has experienced improvement in other symptoms; and
- Can mask for 5 additional days when around others, except when eating. If a student cannot mask, follow <u>DESE protocol/FAQ</u>.

If an individual tests positive as part of a group pooled test, the 5-day period begins the day the positive group pooled test is collected OR the day symptoms begin, whichever occurs first.

## **About "Testing to Return:"**

- Only Binax and iHealth at-home or school-administered tests must be used for return testing after an infection.
- Students may test-to-return at home any time between Days 6-11.
  - The APS can provide ONE school-based test per student between Days 6-11.
  - Families may use at-home iHealth/Binax tests provided by APS OR purchase their own.
  - Students who test positive must continue to isolate.
  - Students who test negative may attend school the following day.

## • Test-to-Return Clinics:

- APS will continue to hold Test-to-Return Clinics at AHS on Mondays-Thursdays from 3:30-4:30pm through January 31st, 2022.
- Beginning 2/1/2022, we will discontinue clinics and individual families will be responsible for testing-to-return and reporting their results here.
