I have been participating in the overnight street parking pilot, and want to extend my gratitude for this pilot and my strong support to continue this pilot / extend the program. I am a resident in a multifamily home (Newland Rd in the Heights) and we park one car on our residential street right in front of the house. This pilot has allowed us to avoid navigating an inconvenient, difficult tandem parking situation in our driveway with 3 to 4 cars owned by multiple households (blocking each other in) - the driveway's geometry is tricky. Having our one car on the street is very important to us. Without that option, things get complicated (moving around cars owned by multiple households with the dog, stroller, etc.). That said, we are happy to bring our car into the driveway to facilitate snow clearing or other Town/neighborhood needs. We very much hope that we will be permitted to park overnight and that a reasonable cost is associated with the permit.

I sincerely hope you consider this request. I kindly ask that you let me know what decision is made (either way), because our households will have to make arrangements with advance notice if we are no longer allowed to park on the street.
